We hope to see all our parents and caregivers during Catholic Schools Week to help us celebrate. Your support is essential and makes HTG such an amazing community! Thank you.

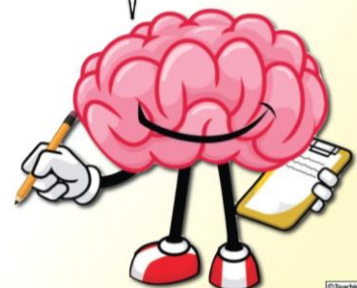

they shall be comforted.

Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right:
they shall be satisfied.

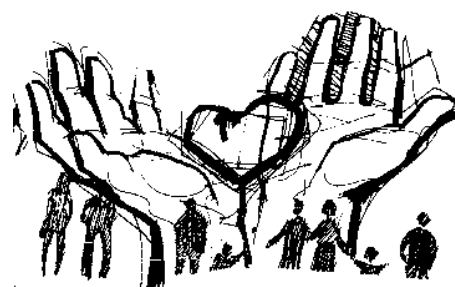
Happy the merciful:
