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Dear Parents and Friends,

Week three has concluded already and what a busy time it has been.

Our goals for 2017 have been and continue to be:

Religious Education:

That students will develop their understanding of Christian Living as evidenced through service to others and the wider community with class and school based social justice actions.

Literacy

Students will improve their comprehension skills to grow by two clusters (K-2) and one cluster (3-6) on the DEC Literacy Continuum (Comprehension & Reading Texts).

Numeracy

All students to move at least 1 growth point in Multiplication & Division.

At the end of last term you received your child's report and met with class teachers. Thank you for taking the time to do that and thank you to our teachers for giving their time for you and your child. Either at this meeting or after you would have set some goals for your child to achieve for term 3. How are those goals going?

Are we here at HTG achieving our goals and have we implemented strategies to make sure this happens?

Yes we have.

The majority of children have made growth in Numeracy and Literacy and those who have become "stuck" have been identified and strategies have been implemented to make sure they become "unstuck". How do we do this? Through **case management**. Case management is where a team of teachers including the class teacher, diversity teacher, stage leader and myself analyse work samples, listen to the class teacher and make decisions for the best way forward so that we can ensure that progress is made.

We continually update student goals and adjust the lessons so that all can achieve.

How can you help? Set goals with your child and if you have already done so check in often to see whether these goals are being achieved. If you would like to discuss your child's progress please do not hesitate to contact the class teacher.

Together as a team we can achieve.

SKIP A THON:

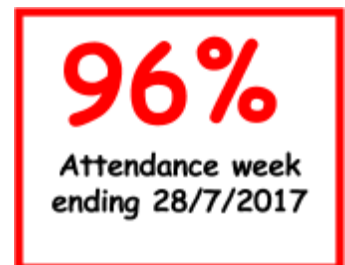

BOOK WEEK 2017 - Escape to Everywhere

The Book Week theme for 2017 is ***Escape to Everywhere***, which will be celebrated over two weeks at Holy Trinity, commencing on **Wednesday 16th of August**. Book Week is an excellent opportunity to celebrate a variety of literary experiences and enjoy the mystery, journey and imagination that reading a great book provides.



To begin the reading explosion, the children will enjoy a **Musical Performance - 'Super Duper!'**. The cost of this performance has been kindly paid for by the school. Through this performance the children will be able to experience a variety of stories, including a few of the Shortlisted Books from the Children's Book Council of Australia.

To combine our love and appreciation for both books and our Grandparents we will have a day of celebration on Friday 18th of August. Grandparents are warmly invited as guests of honour to celebrate their importance in the lives of their grandchildren. We will commence the day with a special liturgy, followed by our **Book Character Parade**. All **HTG children** are asked to come to school dressed as their favourite book character. Grandparents, parents and preschoolers are also invited to dress as their favourite book character and participate in our parade. Creativity is the key, we would like to spare any unnecessary expense and ask that students use what they have at home.

Afterwards, grandparents, parents, family and friends are most welcome to visit the classrooms and Book Fair, followed by a picnic morning tea together. We look forward to celebrating with you.

We hope you will also make time to visit the collection of story and information books for sale at our annual **Scholastic Book Fair**. Come along and look at all the exciting books, posters and extra goodies that will be available. You may wish to purchase a book and donate it to the school. Cash and credit cards are welcome and goods must be paid for on the day.
