SHROVE TUESDAY

Next Tuesday we celebrate *Shrove Tuesday*. Shrove Tuesday originated during the Middle Ages. As in contemporary times, food items like meats, fats, eggs, milk, and fish were regarded as restricted during Lent. To keep such food from being wasted, many families would have big feasts on Shrove Tuesday in order to consume those items that would inevitably become spoiled during the next forty days. The English tradition of eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday came about as a way to use as much milk, fats, and eggs as possible before Ash Wednesday began.

Traditionally at Holy Trinity our parents cook pancakes for all our children.

We thank the parents who have already volunteered their time to cook pancakes and we welcome anyone else who is free from 10am on Tuesday 28th February for about an hour.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Shrove Tuesday is followed by ASH WEDNESDAY which marks the beginning of the Church season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is one of the most important holy days in the liturgical calendar.

Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer.

Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday.



Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. Please join us for our Ash Wednesday Liturgy at 9:15am in the hall.

GROWTH MINDSET

Following last Newsletter, some tips on how to foster a growth mindset at home.

The way parents talk about ability and learning can have powerful effects on what children believe about themselves. As parents it is important to develop a growth mindset about yourself. One of the most powerful ways that parents can model growth mindset is by being willing to fail and eager to learn from setbacks. When parents talk positively about the mistakes the children or themselves make, then, children see mistakes as a critical part of the learning process. Here are some questions to ask yourself:

- How often do you notice and praise, effort, strategies and progress?
- What thoughts do you have when your child struggles? How could you frame their struggle in a growth mindset way by helping them understand that this is when their brain is arowing the most?
- What thoughts do you have when your child excels? How could you frame this in a growth mindset way, eg by talking about the process they went through to be successful.
- What kind of fixed and growth mindset comments do your children make?
