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Dear Parents and Carers,

Wishing you all the blessings of this Easter Season.

Christ's Resurrection is the fulfilment of the promises both of the Old Testament and of Jesus himself during his earthly life. Welcome to term 2 2017. Congratulations to the parents and students of kindergarten on completing the first term of a 13 year learning journey.

Teachers will send home a document this week that outlines the intended learning for this term in each stage. Please take this information and keep it handy so that you can refer to it often with your child. This information helps you to ask questions of your child about their learning. Instead of asking what did you learn today, your questions can be more specific, eg stage 3 "what does democracy mean?", "how did Federation change our country?', Year 4 you might ask in the second half of the term, "What are the parts of the Mass". If you ask what did you learn today you may not get much information but if the children know you know about their learning and are interested in learning with them, then, they will be more enthusiastic to share.

A few important dates are coming up this term that need to be noted. All school events are created to build community spirit, to support your children.

Community events this term include:

Celebration of Learning, Wednesday 31 May, an opportunity for our students your children to showcase their learning and a chance for you to show them how interested you are in what the children are learning. Children need an audience and a purpose to improve their learning.

Principal parent coffee morning: Another opportunity to see how learning happens in the classroom. This has been changed to **Tuesday 16th May.** All welcome, mums dads, grandparents come and have a chat with other parents and myself and then we will walk through the learning spaces to observe the children learning' you are their audience, their purpose is to have a growth mindset about learning.

Parent teacher interviews: Tuesday 27th June and Wednesday 28th June. An important time to stop and reflect on the goals in learning for your child in the second semester.

Mother's Day Stall and Raffle. Mother's day stall will be held on **Friday 12th May**. We ask for donations for the Mother's Day raffle which will be drawn on Friday 12th May. Please send in donations as soon possible and tickets will be sent home this week.

NAPLAN. The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (**NAPLAN**) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. All students in these year levels are expected to participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Measles outbreak in western Sydney


There is currently an outbreak in South Western and Western Sydney, with at least 9 people having acquired the disease in the region during March 2017.

The reported cases include children and infants who attended childcare centres and secondary schools. There is potential for the measles outbreak to spread further as the infected young people have large social networks both with and outside of their schools, and some have travelled on public transport whilst infectious. Measles is highly infectious and anyone who isn't vaccinated is at risk of infection if they have had contact with an infectious case.

Immunisation is effective in preventing measles. It is important for everyone to ensure that they have received at least two doses of measles containing vaccine (MMR). Infants and young children are vaccinated with measles containing vaccine at 12 months and 18 months of age. Older children and adults born during or after 1966 should ensure that they have been vaccinated with two doses of vaccine. Unless people are certain they have two doses of measles vaccine, they should visit their GP as soon as possible for free measles vaccination.

The first sign of measles symptoms should seek medical advice as soon as possible phoning the emergency department or GP beforehand, stay home from work or school, and limit other activities to avoid exposing other vulnerable people, such as infants, to the infection.
