School Fees


School fees are now overdue. Please arrange payment at your earliest convenience. If you are experiencing any difficulties please contact the school office.

The School Student Transport Scheme (Opal Card)

The School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) provides eligible school students with free or subsidised travel on public transport between home and school, on trains, buses, ferries and long distance coach services.

Many students will automatically receive a School Opal card for the 2017 school year.

However you will need to complete a form online at www.transportnsw.info/school-students if:

- Applying for an SSTS Opal Card for the first time
- Enrolling in Kindergarten
- Progressing from Year 2 to Year 3
- Progressing from Year 6 to Year 7
- Changing name, school and/or address
- Requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation.

Applications must be made by a parent or legal guardian of the student. Applications are subject to eligibility criteria.


