were such a dedicated team, who gave up their recesses and lunchtimes to prepare for each debate. Well done on your achievements throughout the competition and all your hard work.



Last Sunday, Australians observed Father's Day. It is a day for people to show their appreciation for fathers and father figures. Father figures may include stepfathers, fathers-in-law, guardians and family friends. The idea of a special day to honour fathers and celebrate fatherhood was introduced in the United States. A woman called Sonora Smart Dodd was inspired by the <u>American Mother's Day celebrations</u> and planned a day to honour fathers early in the 20th century. The first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane, Washington on June 19, 1910.
