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Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to the parents and carers who have spoken to their children about using positive language. The language used at school contributes to the school climate. Therefore, using positive language helps create a positive climate where all students feel safe and secure. If there are incidents of inappropriate language used, parents will be notified. I ask that if this occurs, parents take the opportunity to discuss the importance of using appropriate language.

Dismissal Procedure and Pick Up Arrangements

In the matter of safety we ask for all parents and carers to support the school afternoon dismissal procedure. The afternoon dismissal can be quite hectic and we want all children to leave safely. The procedure is as follows:

- School gates are opened at 3.10pm for parents and carers to collect the children.
- Once the gates are opened, we ask parents to wait so the bus children can exit.
- All other children are asked to wait under the shelter for their pick up.
- If regular pick up arrangements change the school needs to be notified.

In last weekend's Gospel we heard about Jesus' encounter with a man who was deaf and had an impediment to his speech.
